BISHOP'S EPISTLE

We have arrived at the 4th quarter of this unusual year of 2020 which has been full of surprises often of the negative variety. For the largest part of this year, our country has been working under less than optimal circumstances. Just when it seems that the coronavirus is beginning to fade, it reappears in another place causing additional concern. This of course affects our churches and all churches in general throughout our country. We can have church services with proper precautions, but we are limited in our usual activities such as dinners. baptisms. confirmations. funerals. weddings, and ordinations where everyone who wishes cannot attend. This fellowship and being together is so much a part of what a church family is. The fear of the virus has served to isolate many of our parishioners who are afraid of being in larger groups. Most of our clergy are doing their best to stay in contact with those who are unable to come to church. It is helpful to establish a buddy system with parishioners who live alone whereby they can contact each other on a regular basis. We had an incident at St. Alban's Cathedral recently when a parishioner called a homebound parishioner and realized during the call that her friend may be having a stroke and called for emergency help. This saved the parishioner who was indeed in the early stages of a stroke.

Updates on Synods

As previously communicated, due to the pandemic, the DMA Synod and the critical Synod business of the DEUS and DEUS Standing Committee were conducted via Zoom videoconferences in August and September.

DMA Synod

Bishop Giffin, Bishop Ordinary, reported that the DMA held their 11th Synod on September 12, 2020, via a Zoom videoconference. Diocesan Business was conducted during the one-day

actions meeting, in which several were addressed, including the adoption of the 2021 Budget, with a small increase, and various elections and appointments to Diocesan Committees. Provincial administrative needs were covered. A State of the Diocese Address was provided by the Rt. Rev Robert Giffin, as well as a greeting read from Presiding Bishop Grundorf. The turnout for the Synod was good with all parishes and missions being represented. The new mission of Christ Anglican Church in Florence Kentucky (near Cincinnati, Ohio) was welcomed. Re-elected as President of the Standing Committee was the Rev. Canon Robert Jennings and Rick Watson was elected to the Standing Committee also elected Secretary of the Standing Committee. The Judith Diocesan Treasurer, Valleio, Diocesan Court members were also re-elected. positions All previous appointed were reappointed.

DEUS Synod

The critical items were handled by the DEUS Standing Committee for the DEUS Synod. These included submittal of my resignation after a 5vear extension to Synod 2020. A motion proposed by Bishop Coadjutor Chandler Jones to refuse my resignation and extend my retirement until the end of the next Synod 2021 was voted on (by secret voting) and approved. I gave a State of the Diocese Address which is available on the APA website. All those who are currently in appointed positions were reappointed. Elected positions will remain in place until Synod 2021. Key business reports such as the Board of Examining Missions Chaplains and Domestic distributed before the meeting. The Summary of Treasurer report/2021 budget discussions occurred. The 2021 Budget voting was postponed until October 2020 so the Finance Committee could consider additional data presented.

APA Synod

The Provincial Synod 2020 business has been postponed until 2021. Elected positions will remain in place until the next Provincial Synod. Next year's DEUS, DMA, and APA Synods will be held in July 2021 hosted by St. Barnabas' Anglican Church in Dunwoody (Atlanta), GA. (The DOW Synod is to be determined.)

Positive Happenings (events)

With all that has been happening this year out of the ordinary, we have had some very positive events for which to be thankful. We have had a number of men who have completed and passed their canonical examinations this year and are now scheduled for Ordination. These men and their proposed ordination dates are listed under the Ad Clerum section of this Epistle.

In Retrospect

Following on this thought, as I anticipate my retirement as the Diocesan and Presiding Bishop of the APA/DEUS in the summer of 2021, I reflect on the many years I have served as a parish priest, Suffragan Bishop, and then as Diocesan and finally Presiding Bishop. The years have gone by quickly and the amazing thing is to witness the way God has continued to bless our Jurisdiction with so many wonderful and highly talented men for the ministry. I am thankful for the faithful lay men and women who have been a part of this church, many of whom have now gone on before us, without whom we could not have survived and prospered. I think at this time of David "Dave" Arnott, who died earlier this year, that so many of you knew, and because of the restrictions on church gatherings, was buried only recently. Dave was an integral part of the DEUS and APA Lay Leadership. He served as a Provincial Council member, Standing Committee member, DEUS Budget Analyst, and as a Cathedral and Diocesan IT resource. He was also a steadfast and devoted parishioner of the Cathedral, with his wife Shearon, for over 2 decades, where he served on the Vestry and as Sr. Warden. May he rest in peace.

Tapestry of the Church

To those God has raised up as shepherds and

guides I am eternally grateful for their ministry and their influence upon others and me. I am reminded of St. Paul's words from the Book of Ephesians 4:11 & 12, where he said, "and he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ." This passage from the Book of Ephesians reminds us we are not all called to the same office and ministry in the church. As time and situations change, our clergy mature and develop their gifts and talents which God has given each one. Not all bishops, priests, and deacons will express their ministry in the same way based upon their development and circumstance. But, it is all part of the great eternal plan of God how we fit into this tapestry of the body of Christ we call the Church.

Tragedy in the DOW

I was informed on September 9, that Father Bill Baker and his family in Medford, Oregon lost their home to a wildfire. The entire area was a total loss in the worst fires in Oregon history. I later spoke with Fr. Bill. He has moved with his family to his father in-law's home on the coast of Oregon and plans to remain in that area. He will not be returning to Medford and this will be a great loss to St. Andrew's Church in nearby Jacksonville, where he served in a team ministry with Father Chris Smith. I have since spoken with Canon Hawkins, Vicar General of the Diocese of the West, who plans to work with the DOW to set up a GoFundMe crowdfunding campaign. Once set up, we will send out more details on the GoFundMe link either through email or our website. Please pray for Fr. Bill and his family and also for St. Andrew's Church and Fr. Chris.

Lenten Appeal Results for Domestic Mission Met and Exceeded Goal

Thank you to the parishes and missions who contributed to the Lenten Appeal designated for Mission Churches St. Matthias and St. James the Great in eastern Alabama, Fr. John Klein, Vicar. I thought with all that was happening with the pandemic, we may not make it. Oh ye of little

faith! The St. Matthias Mission made a huge difference with their generous gifts and so many others made it a remarkable success. One of our younger priests, Fr. Stephen Miller and his family are moving to Dothan, Alabama, to assist both churches as a curate, under the tutelage of Fr. John Klein.

Looking to the Future

As we enter the fall season on the calendar, may we do so with renewed energy and vision for the future. The pollsters tell us indicators are that church attendance generally has fallen off in the last decade. While the Covid-19 may have an additional negative influence on the polls concerning church attendance, I am convinced despite the polling, there are people in need of a church especially at this time in history. Parents are concerned about the culture in our country which is becoming more and more secular and the public schools are the breeding ground for this. People are looking for alternatives in the Christian Schools which are usually attached to a church. The newest Classical Christian School in the APA has started at St. Alban's Cathedral with over 40 children, most of whom are not from St. Alban's. It is gratifying to hear the children starting the school day with Morning Prayer complete with the singing of the canticles. St. Paul's Church, Melbourne, Florida, is planning to start a school in the fall of 2021. Please pray for the success of these schools.

Blessing and best wishes as we pray we will be emerging from the Covid-19 fear soon.
