BISHOP'S EPISTLE

All Saints Blessings

I read this quote from the new Roman Catholic Archbishop of St. Louis. "simple human experience tells us that everything but God wears out sooner or later and is bound to disappoint us." Do we really believe that or are we in danger of placing too much hope in earthly things? No matter what the earthly outcome, our hope must ultimately be in God. The first week in November, we have All Saints Day on Sunday followed by All Souls Day on Monday and then Election Day on Tuesday. The very sequence asks us a question: Where do we place our hope? Does it ultimately rest in Jesus as our eternal destiny, or do we have to confess that, judged by the way we have spent our time and energy, we have placed our hope in a political party? The Psalmist reminds us, "It is better to trust in the Lord than to put our confidence in man...it is better to trust in God than to put our confidence in princes." (Psa. 118) Our Christian Faith teaches us to place our ultimate hope in God.

Looking Forward

Most of us have grown weary of social unrest and isolation in the year 2020 and will be happy to see these end. In spite of the stubborn virus, we have learned some valuable lessons in dealing with it both personally and as families and also as a parish. One of the special disciplines many parishioners have discovered is doing the Daily Offices of Morning and Evening Prayer live streaming with the clergy of the Church. I hope and pray that all will keep this discipline that began during the quarantine and will continue it on as a regular habit. Families spending time together has been another valuable blessing as we look forward to a healthy and happy year ahead.

We are living through one of the most divisive political times that I can remember. This situation

combined with the Coronavirus creates an unstable atmosphere in our nation. It is the Church of which we are a part by our Baptism, that is to provide stability to the world, nation, and communities in which we live. God has called us by our birth to be a part of this time in history. This is God's world and as Christians, we are to be part of his saving work which comes through the life of our resurrected Lord, our Savior Jesus Christ. We are not to moan and complain about being part of a world that seems so far gone from righteousness, but rather we are to take up the mantle of our Lord and be his witnesses that he is Lord and Savior of this world. We must be the salt and the light in the world in which we live by reflecting the hope and joy we have as Christians.

The Challenge

A critically important part of our Faith, especially under our present circumstances, is to be courageous and single-minded in our work for our Lord and his Church. It may be tempting to withdraw from our faith and practice because life in the world around us is not easy these days. It is not as compelling to go to church when you need to wear a mask and physical distance from your friends or to take the sacrament in a different way that we are accustomed. It is sometimes easier to stay home and watch the Eucharist on video than to make the effort to get together and travel vourself to church. Nevertheless, we are encouraged with the admonition "Forsake not the gathering of yourselves together." Heb. 10:25.

At this week of the confluence of All Saints Day, All Souls Day and Election Day, the Psalmist in 122 reminds us, "I was glad when they said unto me; We will go into the House of the Lord." Our gaze is directed not at the House of

Representatives, nor at the Senate or the White House, but at something more important and enduring—the House of the Lord. I pray this message resonates in the depths of your hearts and may the peace of God which passes all understanding remain with you always.
